2. Answer question A and C on page 230. (A can be oral if you have someone at home to bounce ideas off or written into your copy if you wish. Either option are perfect!)

2. Busy at Maths page 151 Q1 and 2 (Read the blue box carefully, try do question 1 and come back here for the answer! Answer to question 1 = 13, 21, 34, 55, 89)

1. Cad = what, cé = who, cad a dhéanann an ghaoth leis an slinnte = what does the wind have to do with the title and críochnaigh an abairt = finish the sentence

English:

1. Answer questions D on page 230 of Racing Ahead
2. Complete a word study for the words 'adamant' and 'preliminary.' In your word study, include how many syllables there are, antonyms, synonyms, definition and put it into a sentence please.
3. Continue reading another chapter of Journey To The River Sea

2. Choose two of the different types of farming in Ireland (seen in section I, page 231) and compare and contrast the two. Comparing means finding things that they might have in common and contrasting means finding things that they may differ on.

2. Busy at Maths page 152 Q 3, 4 and 5 (Remember that a square number is the answer of some multiplied by itself → $2^2 = 4$. 4 is the square number)

English:

1. Complete section F of page 231 Racing Ahead (Remember:
 - a. Nouns = person, place or thing
 - b. Verbs = doing/action words
 - c. Adverbs = words that describe verbs
 - d. Adjectives = words that describe nouns
 - e. Pronouns = words that replace nouns (eg. Brian borrowed the bike → He borrowed it)
 - f. Prepositions = the placement of a noun (under, above, over..._
 - g. Conjunctions = words that comment clauses (while, and)
2. Add 3 more words of your own to each column
3. Continue reading Journey To The River Sea
