Dictation is good to help your child to practice writing their sentences and recap on the tricky words which we had been practising in class. Parents can call out the sentences and children will write them independently. Encourage your child to focus on writing the letters correctly and use finger spaces between words. Maths

Continue to revise the theme of money- All workbook pages for this week are based on money also.

- Practise recognising coins up to 20 cent (1c, 2c, 5c, 10c, 20c) e.g What coin is this? Yes, it is a 5c coin. So that means it is worth 5 cent.
- Practise exchanging coins of the same value e.g If I give you two 5c coins, how much is there altogether?/ If you give me two 5c coins I can give you back one 10c coin because they have the same value.
- Use coins in pretend shopping activities. Role-play would be a lovely way to practise using money in exchange for objects.
- Try to encourage use of correct vocabulary: cost, price, cheap/expensive, change, too much/too little
- Solve practical tasks and problems using money e.g which items can be bought with a given coin?
- Spend the same amount of money in two different ways e.g 2c or two 1c coins

Other ideas:

* Coin caterpillar: Make a caterpillar with coins and find his total.



* Coin rubbings- place the coin under a piece of paper and rub over the using a crayon. Add the totals together.



* Roll the dice and make that amount using coins. E.g roll a 9 and then make 9c using the coins.



* Money sorting- practise sorting the coins into groups. One circle for 1 cent coins, one circle for 2c coins, etc..



* Money boat- see how many coins can float until the boat starts to sink. How much money in total?



* Show me 10c- see how many ways you can of making different amounts of money.



* Make the amount in the cupcake cover.



Revision:

- List of maths games available on seesaw.
- Revise writing the numbers 1-10.
- Practise counting up to 20 on a number line and counting backwards from 20.
- Practise finding the number that comes before/after/ in between other numbers.
- Continue to revise number bonds for each number e.g Show me four ways to make 8.4+4/5+3/6+2/8+0
- Continue to practise using vocabulary: more than/less than/most/least/same as
- Practise reading the time.
